POLICY SUBCOMITTEE

I am unable to attend today as I am on call for my job. I will make sure to get in touch with the incoming chair and hand over all policy records. I have updated the By-laws, but they have not been sent out. The incoming chair will need to know where to send these. One issue with the by-laws: the by-laws are supposed to have our sub-committee guidelines sent with them. As I've been telling this body for the past 6-9 months, some guidelines have been lost, and myself nor the previous policy chair were ever in possession of them. Missing are Literature, H&I, Public Information. The only ones policy has are web committee and MARLCNA guidelines. At this point in time, it may not be a bad idea to have those sub-committees come up with current guidelines for their prospective subcommittee. This body needs to decide what to do and how important is it that they be attached and sent to the attorney

I did not make any updates or changes to the Policy log. My computer crashed recently and I have just replaced it but have not had time to do updates. I will give the incoming chair any policy that has passed from March and June minutes so it can be updated.

As for the 71 so called corrections to the policy log, to refresh everyone's memory, an individual brought a list to this committee of changes to be made to the policy log. These changes have not been made. I did review some of the changes before my computer crashed. Some changes are "deleting" policy that is no longer relevant some are pure grammatical changes. However, some are for clarification purposes. I have a problem with some of these changes. I do not believe all of them are "housekeeping" I know past precedence was to submit motions to fix these clarifications and to do so on a regional level without group conscience. Technically, I suppose there is nothing wrong with this, but spiritually I believe there is. Although these types of changes have been made in the past, it does not make them right. When I sat on this regional floor as RCM 5=6 years ago, the then policy chair and vice chair made a regular habit of this. I was opposed to it then but apparently was in the minority. We are not here to fix and reword what the groups have approved without informing the groups before we make changes just because "we know better". Just my belief, however it is all a moot point as my commitment is up as of today.

I was asked about precedence by a member of this committee, I was told precedence basically sets policy and has to be followed until policy is put in place to change precedence. You may here about this from that individual today. We have no policy that states we must follow precedence if we have no policy. Confusing, isn't it? I know legal courts and such use precedence when they have no law, but isn't it supposed to help us, not tie our hands? Who's to say if we make a poor decision one time, we continue to make poor decisions based on precedence alone until we make policy? Maybe the current situation is not exactly the same as 2 years ago; maybe current members have more experience with traditions and service to render a different decision today than in years past. Again, do we tie our hands just for precedence's sake? So why don't we just go thru our minutes, pull out all decisions that were made on this regional floor without needing a group conscience, and make a special section in the policy log titled "Precedence Setting Decisions" so we follow them just like policy? That was meant facetiously. Oh, I guess that would make them policy, huh? Just thought I would share this with you since I believe it will come up today and I cannot be there. With all that being said, I would like thank the groups for allowing me to serve. I've gained so much from serving.

Addendum # 4:

NAWS OPERATIONS:

**NAWS NEWS
April 2009**

We would like to take this opportunity to be accountable and respond to the ongoing e-mail thread that many members have received and disseminated to others regarding information about the NAWS Executive Director's salary. This information contained both accurate and inaccurate information, but rather than debating details we want to provide some accurate information and our perspective on this.

The Executive Committee of the World Board serves as the personnel committee of the board; we are charged with annual review and appraisal of the Executive Director. In 2002, after we

changed from having a “Co-Executive Director” arrangement to having a single Executive Director, the Executive Committee undertook an exhaustive comparison of our executive compensation compared to other similar organizations. To find our place in the picture, we looked at such things as number of employees, branch offices internationally and annual revenues. We also sought to equalize cost of living factors to account for the location of our office in Los Angeles.

For this analysis, we used Guide Star (<http://www2.guidestar.org/>), a leading resource for just this sort of information on non-profits. The result was that we determined that our executive compensation was quite low compared to the market. So much so, in fact, that in order to bring our Executive Director to a level more in line with a fair market compensation, we felt it would be more prudent to implement a series of salary increases over the next few years rather than taking a single dramatic jump.

This was done, of course, in conjunction with an assessment of our Executive Director’s performance. Our ED had, over the past several years, been rigorously pursuing his own personal and professional development, including pursuing a degree, serving as the chairperson of two committees for an international association of non-profit executives, currently serving as an association committee member, and leading NAWS through a process of adopting and implementing strategic planning that was transforming our organization.

We found ourselves in a position where in our assessment, our ED’s performance was excellent by virtually any measure, but he was significantly under-compensated.

This was a situation we felt needed to be corrected, and we did correct it.

We welcome accountability to the fellowship we serve on matters like this. Unfortunately, in this case, the method chosen by some to raise their concerns was to send out e-mail to large lists of members with accusations and information ranging from straightforward and accurate in some instances to outlandish and potentially destructive in others. It has been gratifying to see that, as always, many of our members of good will who really want to understand simply reached out and asked. Enough did, in fact, that we felt this mention in *NAWS News* might be helpful to others who may have wondered what this was about. We always invite your direct inquires on anything like this to worldboard@na.org.

We never have and still do not discuss the specifics of people’s compensation at the WSO, because we believe that the privacy of our special workers needs to be respected. On the other hand, we believe that we ought to be transparent and open with the fellowship about the general principles we are operating under regarding compensation, and the general ranges we believe are appropriate for the various levels of responsibility at NAWS. The general principle here is that we do periodically look at the compensation levels of other similar organizations for their staff, and we do attempt to ensure that our staff is fairly compensated for their efforts on our behalf. We cannot always pay staff at the level we’d like to be based upon their talent and dedication, but we do evaluate their performance regularly and make reasonable efforts to retain the excellence, experience, and dedication that is so common among our staff through fair and equitable compensation practices.

Page # 2: - 1st Bullet:

Remove the word medication and insert substance's

Page # 3: - 2nd Quote:

Take Out Completely: (This is not her experience)

Medication in recovery on Page # 7: line # 10:

Take out craving and replace it with obsession

Page # 8: Quote under Bullets take out:

“Everything that accurs in the course of NA service must be motivated by the desire to more successfully carry the message to the addict that still suffers.”

Page # 8: last paragraph on page 8 and goes into page # 9:

Remove that paragraph but leave the last sentence.

Being of service to the fellowship that saved our lives is an act of love, and is not conditioned on a specific position or title. Then put that sentence under the new last paragraph starting with ---The primary purpose of our groups -- on page # 8.

Table of contents: medication in Recovery:

Remove and for being of service while taking medication out of the sentence.

Hello Family,

As always, a lot of work these past three months, and getting excited about the Conference Agenda Report as it nears. Ed and I have traveled to, The Zonal Forum, Lancaster Area Workshop, and the Mid-Atlantic Regional Literature workshop on the Living Clean Project piece.

NAWS Update

The fiscal year has ended for NAWS and it has been a difficult one for NAWS. They have been dealing with the financial struggle with sending The NA Way, Reaching Out, NAWS News, translation costs, and developmental literature. The NAWS staffs are encouraging everyone to download this and print out any type of material that is being sent to you in print.

There is a new membership survey available online at <http://questionnaire.disc.na.org> , Two years ago almost 10,000 members took the survey around the world. The survey will be available online until December 31st and the results of the survey will be at the World Service Conference.

The Service System project workgroup met in April and agreed on fundamental needs that an effective service system must meet. One idea that they are starting with is a worldwide NAWS Service System Vision statement that will be in the Conference Agenda Report this year.

The Living Clean workgroup met in May and reviewed the third chapter of the Living Clean book length piece, that will be coming out for approval in 2011's CAR. We should be seeing the Third and Fourth Chapters soon.

The In Times of Illness workgroup finished compiling all of the review and input for the Conference Agenda Report. The Review and Input draft was downloaded from the NAWS website a total of 1057 times. The workgroup appreciates all review and input and looks forward to seeing it in the CAR this year.

The NA Way Magazine's subscription guidelines are being revised to include how members can submit artwork and photographs. We will see the final guidelines once they have been corrected.

As stated before the NAWS Fiscal Year has ended and they are in the process of finalizing all of the adjusting details that it takes to close out the year and prepare for the audit. Although they still showed a loss, the income stabilized the loss primarily due to the sale of literature. The fiscal year expenses reached over \$783,000.00 this figure rose dramatically with giving away the Fifth Edition Basic Texts they still had in stock after the Sixth Edition was released.

Fellowship contributions showed a dramatic decline. NAWS only had \$807,711.00 in fellowship donations which is about \$200,000.00 under budget. They do not understand

why there has been so much of a decline this fiscal year, and are encouraging members to write their thoughts to worldboard@na.org.

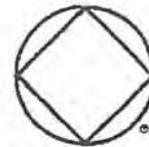

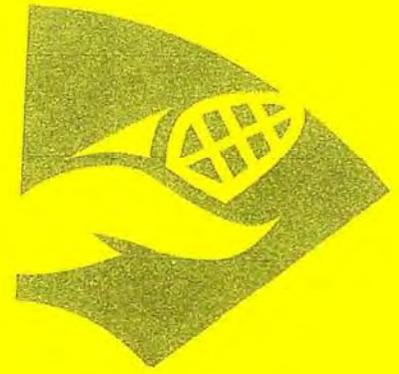
