RD Report June 2018 Kathleen M.

Hello Everyone,

It has been a busy quarter but all is well. I'm submitting an Expense report, which includes costs incurred for the Mid-Atlantic mailbox and printing which includes the cost of the WSC Final report. I'll make arrangements with Jodi to transfer the Region's mail over to her.

As you can see Jodi and I returned from the WSC safe and sound. Everyone should have a separate report for the World Service Conference. Some of the main topics at the WSC was Zonal Forums as another level of service, their best practices, the Future of the WSC, Inspection Request, NAWS financial reporting, Virtual meetings, DRTs and Public Relations, aside from the typical NAWS reports (HRP, Annual Report, etc.). Please take a look over the report and let me know if you have any questions.

A lot happened at the WSC, including the adoption of zonal representatives for zones that have two or more unseated communities. All Project Plans were passed that were presented in the Conference Approval Track, which included a Workgroup on the Future of the WSC. The initial focus for the workgroup in the project plan that was adopted at WSC 2018 reads:

"We want to focus our efforts this cycle on building consensus on what a sustainable, effective WSC means and what it might look like. In light of that shared vision, we would also like to advance the discussion on WSC seating."

Additionally, this workgroup, as described in the project plan, is tasked with furthering the following approaches from the 2018-2020 Strategic Plan:

- A. Strengthen collaboration among zonal forums and between NAWS and zonal forums.
- B. Collect and share best practices of zonal forums.

The above was taken from a recent E-Blast from World Services. It has been the main topic of discussion at the last two NEZF virtual meetings which has focused on the nomination and voting process of a Zonal participant from the NEZF. During the North East Zonal Forum meeting at the WSC, I nominated Adam H. from Connecticut. Knowing him for sometime, he more than qualifies based on his service experience (has attended the WSC multiple times). Other attributes is his ability to see points of view from various perspectives, his in-depth understanding of the history of NA and he continues to participate at the Zonal level even without being an RD or RDA in various positions such as WEB, Secretary, Vice Chair, Chair. He also understands the importance of Group Conscience in regards to the CAR & CAT. There may be a new nomination process introduced at the next virtual NEZF meeting that will be held on June 24th. I recently spoke to Adam and he is still willing to serve. I hope the Region supports his nomination. Other details that will be discussed at the virtual meeting are finishing up the workgroup selection and workshop topics for October's face-to-face NEZF meeting, which will be held in the Northern New England Region.

The NEZF PR ADHOC committee continues to meet monthly. The committee is working on a PR Environmental Scan, which is in the process of being revised based upon input from the members who attended last months meeting. The scan will be available to the Regions and Areas of the Zone for input once the Environmental Scan is approved by the NEZF. The purpose of the scan is to gather information from the NA communities to identify trends and issues directly related to Public Relations and help create a plan based upon the data received. I'm passing around a form titled "Mid-Atlantic Region Area & PR Contact List". Please check the information for your Area and correct any mistakes. Also, please add the contact person for your PR sub-committee including the Chair, Vice Chair and the appropriate contact information. This data will be provided to the NEZF Adhoc PR committee. I have attended several of the PR Adhoc meetings and I have found them to be well attended, informative and productive.

For many years, I have seen the RD return asking this body for direction in regards to the Northeast Zonal Forum. Each time, we've given little input. Most of the discussion has been on whether it's resourceful to send our RD/RDA team to the Zone. At this time, I don't think it's a question of whether we send the RD/RDA team to the Zone but rather should we consider additional representation on behalf of the Mid-Atlantic Region?

A new level of service is coming. The next WSC will be the first Hybrid conference consisting of both voting RDs and Zonal Representatives. Will our Region participate in the process of developing the NEZF into a level of service that will benefit NA as whole, our Region, Areas, and the Groups? Do the Areas, the Groups, and members have enough understanding of the Zones to participate in the Process?

I would like to discuss in New Business the idea of sending an additional participant to serve at the NEZF. Each member Region of the Zone has the option to have 3 Regional elected representatives. Anyone may attend the NEZF but they are unable to fully participate unless they are a regionally elected participant from a member Region. Having another member representing the Region means additional support for our Areas and Groups without the burdens of responsibility that comes with being an RD and RDA. During the next cycle or two (during the transition in adding another level of service) the role of the RD/RDA will continue to expand. More Webinars to attend, more frequent E-blasts, disseminating more information from NAWS etc. It is possible the current Zonal PR ADHOC committee may become a standing Sub-committee and perhaps more standing committees will be created as the Zone transforms into a new level of service.

I propose the following:

The creation of an ADHOC position (Zonal Service Liaison) sent to serve at the NEZF to ensure maximum participation in representing our Region, Areas, and groups during the transition of essentially an entirely new service body. This position would be temporary and unfunded pending the developments of the transition. This participant would not vote but could participate in discussions at the Zone on behalf of the Region. This position would be responsible for attending all NEZF meetings including ADHOCs and/or workgroups at the Zonal level and providing a written report to Region specifically on topics pertaining to moving forward as a new service body. They should also be available to assist interested Areas or Groups in building their understanding of Zones.

I would like to Thank the Region for giving me the opportunity to service. The experience has helped me grow tremendously in my recovery and for that I am truly grateful.

Results of a Meeting with the South Florida Region

3 May 2018

At 6:00 pm, May 2, 2018, representatives from NA World Services, Arne H and Anthony E, met with representatives from the South Florida Region, Jeff P, Regional Delegate; Kevin D, Alternate Delegate; and Mat S., Regional Chair, met to discuss the request for inspection of the *FIPT* records. The purpose of the meeting was to see if it was possible to reach a compromise, so that the region could receive the information they desire in a manner that NA World Services could accommodate.

Following are the points discussed with South Florida related to the ten concerns that were addressed in NA World Services letter dated March 16, 2018 to the South Florida delegate. This inspection will focus on fiscal year 2016, except where otherwise noted below.

- a) Both parties agree that the inspection shall be five working days beginning May 21, 2018 at 9:00 am at the World Service Office main headquarters at 19737 Nordhoff Place, Chatsworth, California 91311. If it is determined by the requestor that NAWS is purposely attempting to delay the completion of the inspection, then South Florida will be allowed to negotiate the possibility of additional time with the assigned Board members.
- b) South Florida is willing to focus on financial records for expenses reported for the world convention in Brazil, in whichever fiscal year they are posted. This includes records for the account opened for NAWS by the ACS in Brazil.
- South Florida agrees to remove the records from Iran, Canada, India, and Belgium from the inspection request.
- d) South Florida maintains its concern #1 regarding donated literature being reflected as a decrease of retail value as opposed to replacement cost.
- e) South Florida maintains both of its concerns that World Board general expenses as well as World Board travel are not being reported accurately.
- f) South Florida agrees to allow the assigned Board members to conduct the review of internal World Board minutes and Executive Committee notes for the period of inspection, to determine that no such undisclosed locations exist as it relates to Concern #3. The assigned Board members can also conduct a review of World Board minutes and Executive notes to identifying any discussion regarding the exempting of double occupancy that exists in those records.
- g) South Florida maintains its concern #4 regarding the equal application of literature discounts.
- h) Both parties agree that NA World Services will provide the designations of FIPT properties as it relates to concern #6.
 - As it relates to concern #10, South Florida desires to see any communications to any internet service providers connected to the Digital Millennium Copyright Act, issued during the inspection period
- i) Both South Florida and NAWS acknowledge that NA World Services has, on multiple occasions, reported to the WSC that the Credit Card guidelines, along with several other policies, located in A Guide to World Services in NA are no longer utilized. This will be acknowledged in the final inspection report.
- j) South Florida requests that the World Board conduct a future examination of the communication processes between a requestor for inspection and NA World Services to see if there is a way to improve for the future, led by a new board member who was not seated during the current process.





Consensus-Based Decision Making

This section summarizes the responses to the questions about the use of consensus-based decision making (CBDM). We asked whether CBDM is used by the regions or any of the areas. The results are shown in the charts below.





Most of the comments about how CBDM is working were positive, with only a few that focused on the challenge of learning how the process works. Several also described using CBDM for discussions, and a formal vote to ratify decisions when needed, or a hybrid of CBDM and parliamentary procedures.


